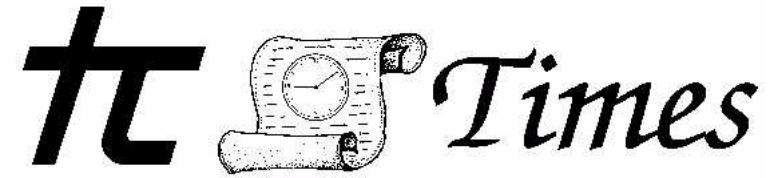

'The case for Easter' by Lee Strobel

How credible is the evidence for the resurrection? Focussing his award winning skills as a legal journalist on history's most compelling enigma, Lee Strobel retraces the startling findings that led him from atheism to belief.

'Who moved the stone?' by Frank Morrison

English journalist Frank Morrison set out to prove that the resurrection of Jesus Christ was a myth. But what he found as he investigated the evidence convinced him that the resurrection is true.

I have read this book from cover to cover and heartily recommend it.

'The passion and the empty tomb' by John Ankerberg & John Weldon

Written after the film release the Passion of the Christ, this book sets out to answer the question, "What came next?" But it does more than that. The authors explore the story, examine the rock solid evidence that the story is true, and explore the impact of this fact on us and the world in which we live.
