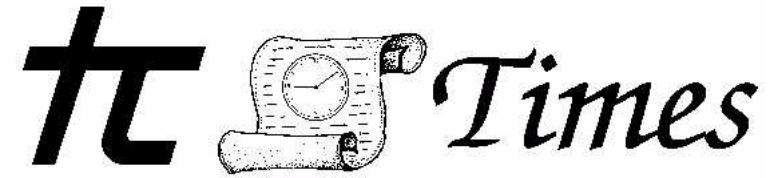

CHRISTIANITY FOR DUMMIES

This user-friendly guide will help to answer your questions about the basic teachings of the Christian faith. It also explores common ground of Christianity and the differences among the major branches. It covers key events in Christian history and key theological issues - and much more.

Use it as a handy reference book, or as a book to answer questions from someone seeking the truth about Christianity.

BY DEMONSTRATION: GOD

Fifty years and one week of L'Abri, by Wade Bradford.

Wade writes as one of the workers at L'Abri. He explains what goes on at The Manor, Gresham, UK, and interweaves the Christian teaching for which L'Abri is famous.

He takes a frank look at L'Abri today. Does it still meet a need? How does it operate today? And what about the legacy of the Schaeffers who founded L'Abri in 1955, and whose vision was 'to show forth by demonstration, in our lives and works, the existence of God'.

A fascinating glimpse of the workings of the Centre, of how things have changed with the times.

ME AND MY Bleeding MOUTH

The painful, true story of Gary McCormick

Gary was one of the visiting 'inmates' of 'The Monastery' (recent BBC TV series).

Gary is a 36 year old Irishman who always felt himself to be 'different' and a misfit.

Born the year of the Irish Troubles, trouble was what he fell into, constantly.

Arrested for the first time at the age of 12, Gary climbed the penal ladder adeptly, ending up in prison on the Isle of Wight for an impetuous London bomb hoax.

His story infuriates, disturbs and frustrates, but he knows his faults, tries hard to make amends, and whatever's thrown at him he won't give up, or shut up for that matter.

Through time spent at Teen Challenge in Wales, Gary is making progress as a Christian and in getting his life together.

A gripping, well written story.
